- Creation of training modules for new and current volunteers available online increasing the organization's capacity to serve a larger number of children and adults in the regional community
- Additional opportunities for more individualized support
- Building a robust team of trained individuals who are ready and prepared to support grieving individuals and families, schools, and workplaces
